#### **MISSION**

Dedicated to providing prevention, support, and intervention to Warren County youth and their families struggling with emotional and behavioral needs so that they may remain in their own home.

### COORDINATED CARE TEAM

The Coordinated Care Team provides wraparound, intervention and prevention services to high risk and multi-need children and their families. The goals of the Coordinated Care Program are to:

- Create a prevention component to support children and their families early in the process
- Monitor and support multi-need children and young adults in placement to shorten stays
- Help multi-need youth and young adults avoid out-of-home placement
- Provide aftercare and support for those released from placement

Coordinated Care works with direct service providers to develop an Individualized Plan of Care to help meet the needs of the child or young adult within the community.

# CLINICAL COMMITTEE

The Clinical Committee is a committee of the Warren County Family and Children First Council composed of representatives from:

- Warren County Board of Developmental Disabilities
- Warren County Juvenile Court
- Warren County Children Services
- Mental Health & Recovery Services of Warren & Clinton Counties

The Clinical Committee provides:

- A broad array of services & support
- Individualized Plans
- Least restrictive setting
- Services are coordinated at both the system & service levels
- Plans that are family driven/youth guided
- Emphasizes early identification & early intervention

# **DIVERSION PROGRAM**

The goal of the Diversion Program is to prevent and reduce unruly behavior. Diversion provides home and school-based case management and therapeutic services to unruly children and their families.

### PARENT SUCCESS

Parent Success is an innovative program that provides support/education to parents/ guardians of school aged youth with behavioral issues. A Prevention Specialist provides at least six home visits to identify concerns unique to the family unit and offers support, education and solutions. The Parent Success Program utilizes an evidenced-based curriculum.

## DRUG & ALCOHOL EDUCATION & PREVENTION

Coordinated Care offers Drug & Alcohol Prevention & Education Services to Warren County Schools at NO COST to the district. Services include (but are not limited to):

- Red Ribbon Week Presentations/Displays
- Tobacco and Substance Abuse Education groups
- Provide aftercare and support for those released from placement
- Speaking at community events or Health and other classes
- Prom/Homecoming presentations.
