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Mental Health Services

The Mental Health Team at Warren County ESC serves youth across a variety of environments, including schools, community settings, and specialized programs.

Our approach provides greater access to services, less time away from school for community appointments, and enhanced collaboration with teachers, school counselors, and administrators.

Students are referred to the Mental Health Program for a range of reasons, including emotional distress, difficulty managing academic expectations, family changes or separations, attention deficit/hyperactivity, depression, anxiety, trauma, and loss.

School-based services are available in multiple districts throughout Warren County, including Little Miami, Carlisle, Greater Ohio Virtual School (GOVS), St. Margaret of York, and Oakwood (Montgomery County).

Community-based services are offered at the Child Advocacy Center, and program-based services are provided through the Learning Center, Social Communications Program, and Wellness Center.
